Summer Term 1: Year 2



Maths

Fractions/Height and Length/Position and Direction

We will continue to look at fractions and use our prior knowledge of timetables to help us find equivalent fractions. We will move on to length and height and learn how to measure objects accurately while also using the four operations to solve length and height problems. After that, we will look at position and direction, which links with the coding we have been doing in computing. We will describe movement using the correct mathematical language.

Key Skills

- Compare and order length and height
- Use a ruler accurately
- Decide the correct measurement unit you should choose for the length/height of the object
- Use mathematical vocabulary to describe position direction movement

Science

Living Things and Their Habitats

In this unit, we will look at how animals live. We will compare habitats and discuss why some animals live in certain places. We will explore food chains and discuss what animals eat. We will also look at what is alive, dead or never alive and how we can know for sure using a scientific method.

Key Skills

Working scientifically

- To perform simple tests in the context of investigating each of the five senses.
- To gather and record data to help in answering questions in the context of collecting information to solve a puzzle.

Key objectives

- Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited
- Describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different animals

Why does Easter matter to Christians?

The children will recognise that God, Incarnation, Gospel and Salvation are part of the 'big story' of the Bible. They will tell stories of Holy Week and Easter and make a link with the idea of Salvation (Jesus rescuing people.) Pupils will give at least three examples of how Christians show their beliefs about Jesus as saviour in church worship

Key Skills

- Identify the core concepts and beliefs studied and give a simple description of what they mean
- Give a good reason for the views they have and the connections they make

History

How Were the Lives of our Famous Queens Different?

In this unit the children will learn about key events in history beyond living memory by looking at Queen Elizabeth 2nd's reign compared to other queens. We will explore the key queens of England, comparing their achievements during their reign while also discussing the impact their reigns have on present day UK.

Key Skills

- Comparing and contrasting past and present-day monarchs
- Discuss how historical resources provide information about past rulers
- Reason out what would make a good ruler in the past compared to present day

Art and Design

Key artist: William Morris

Genre: Block printing

This topic we will be exploring the work of William Morris, looking at different tie dyeing and block printing techniques using foam, we will then plan and create our t-shirt and finally evaluate our work.

Key Skills:

- Developing ideas based on simple drawings which have been discussed and evaluated.
- Dyeing fabrics
- Design and make a print block from craft foam and card.

P.E.

Athletics and Forest School

Our PE session will be delivered by Mr Thompson and a cricket coach. It will mainly take place outdoors. Please ensure your child's PE kit is appropriate for this.

Key Skills

- Use running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination
- Develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance
- Take part in outdoor and adventurous activity challenges both individually and within a team

Making Music

This half term the children will be using Purple Mash to create music digitally, they will explore editing and amending compositions, using different sounds and functions, such as tempo.

Music

This half term the children in Year 2 will have a music specialist coming into school to teach them how to play the ukulele.

Key Skills

- Recognise the structure of verse and chorus as well as experimenting with a range of tuned and un-tuned instruments.
- Learn to maintain a body percussion pattern accurately.
