Choose what they look like, where they come from, decide if they have any special gifts and create a language for them to speak.</p> <p>Create a story about them visiting Earth.</p>	<p><b>How Tall are you?</b></p> <p>Measure your family. Who is the tallest and who is the shortest? If you added all your family's heights together, how tall would it be?</p> <p>Can you find something in your house or local area that is the same height as you?</p>	<p><b>2s, 3s, 5s and 10s</b></p> <p>Can you create a game to teach your friends to help them learn their timetables? It could be a number word search, snakes and ladders, matching cards or even a practical game.</p> <p>We will use them in our lessons to help us learn our timetables together.</p>	<p><b>Will it Float?</b></p> <p>If we were to travel to another country by boat, what would be the best material to make the boat from?</p> <p>Investigate which materials are waterproof and can float.</p> <p>Remember to make predictions before you start your investigation and have a conclusion at the end of your investigation!</p>
