- Suggest reasons for specific outcomes.



Maths

Money/Multiplication and Division

This half term, we will be finishing off our shape unit then moving on to money. The children will recognise and count a range of different values using coins and notes. They will be tasked to find different ways to make different amounts and then solve addition and subtraction money related word problems. We will also be solving problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition, mental methods and multiplication and division facts, including problems in contexts.

Key Skills

- Know the value of different coins.
- Use different coins to make the same amount.
- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.
- Write mathematical statements using the multiplication (\times), division (\div) and equals (=) signs.
- Read scales in divisions of ones, twos, fives and

What is the good news Jesus brings?

We will be able to tell stories from the Bible and recognise a link with a concept of 'Gospel' or good news. We will give clear, simple accounts of what Bible texts (such as the story of Matthew the tax collector) mean to Christians. We will recognise that Jesus gives instructions to people about how to behave.

Key Skills

- Identify the core concepts and beliefs studied and give a simple description of what they mean
- Give a good reason for the views they have and the connections they make

History

The Great Fires of London & Newcastle

In this unit the children will learn about key events in history beyond living memory. They will find out about the Great Fire of London and Newcastle which will help them develop an understanding of the ways in which we can find out about the past through discussing primary sources. This unit also provides an introduction to Samuel Pepys and his infamous diary.

Key Skills:

- Comparing and contrasting past and present-day London, as well as looking at how life was different in the 17th century
- Use some historical sources to investigate the Great Fire of Gateshead and Newcastle
- Compare this significant event with local history and a similar event

PSHE

Art and Design

Key artist: Richard Long

Genre: Sponge and block printing

During this topic we will be exploring the work of Richard Long, we will be practising block and sponge printing techniques exploring the patterns you can create and effects using more or less paint. We will then plan a final print taking influence from the Great Fire of London (topic link) and finally we will evaluate our work.

Key Skills:

- Exploring the effects created by using more/less paint
- Developing control when block painting
- Exploring different patterns that can be created
- More in depth block printing using a variety of colours

P.E.

Our Tuesday PE session will be delivered by Mr Thompson and will mainly take place outdoors. Please ensure your child's PE kit is appropriate for this.

Key Skills

- Recognise the best ways to score points and stop points being scored.
- Recognise how they work best with their partner.

In our dance sessions, we will look at movement focusing on The Great Fire of London.

The children are to come to school in their PE kit on a Monday and Tuesday. This should be with suitable clothing for outdoor sessions. No jewellery to be worn on PE days.

Music

This half term, the children in Year 2 will have a music specialist coming into school to teach them the ukulele.

In addition, we will learn new songs with an emphasis on good diction and word play. We will then be composing our own music based on the song we have learnt.

Key Skills

- Recognise the structure of verse and chorus as well as experimenting with a range of tuned and un-tuned instruments.
- Learn to maintain a body percussion pattern accurately.

This half term, the children will be using Purple Mash to develop their painting skills. We will revisit artists we have looking at and try to recreate their famous pieces. Then create a digital artwork in the style of one of the artists.
