- Keep practising **adding and subtracting using money, measuring using millimetres, centimetres and metres,**

Don't forget to **read daily** and record this in **reading record**, your **weekly spelling challenges** (see weekly sheets) and **Common Exception Words** (see grid in homework book).

Keep practising telling the time – o'clock, quarter past, half past, quarter to, telling the time to the nearest minute, using digital (12/24 hour) and analogue clocks. Does your clock at home have Roman numerals? Can you tell time using Roman numerals? It is something that needs to be practised regularly as it is tricky!
