All families will be asked to complete and return the "Going Home" Arrangements" form. This will show vital information including adults who can collect the children. If there is ever a change in information or routines we ask that you keep staff informed to avoid any confusion.

OUTDOOR PLAY

Our outside area is planned to be an extension of the classroom. Opportunities are provided to promote stimulating learning. Writing, reading and number skills are encouraged and supported through our outdoor provision.



Children are naturally active. To keep fit and healthy they need plenty of fresh air and active play. When children play outside they:

- Enjoy using their seemingly inexhaustible reserves of energy
- Develop muscle control and coordination
- Learn to negotiate obstacles and become aware of space
- Practise skills such as skipping, throwing and catching
- Use all their senses to enjoy the different seasons
- Experience playing with larger toys and materials
- Find out about their environment by exploring, observing and recording what they discover.

You can help prepare your child for outdoor play by making sure that they can put on their wellies and manage some of the fastenings.





In hot weather, please don't forget to apply your child's sun cream before they come into school and ensure they have a named sunhat.

READING AND HOME HELP

When your child starts in Reception Class they will need a book bag which they need to **bring to school every day**. We ask parents to check the bag each night, when they read with their child, for any letters, information or home tasks and activities.



Your child may not get a reading book for the first few weeks in school. They may then be given a picture book without words. By encouraging your child to tell the story using the pictures, we help them to learn that there are a range of strategies available to help them read. It also gives them the opportunity to develop story telling language and use their own creative ideas which assists them greatly in their writing.

Picture books play a very important part in the children learning to read.

Your child will be given a **reading diary.** Staff will read with your child individually at least once a week. They will also read in guided reading groups and with shared texts most days.

The reading diaries have five spaces and we ask that a family member **records each day** (Monday – Friday) that they have read with their child. By sharing the books and practising key words daily the children can make the best possible progress.

SCHOOL UNIFORM



Our children look very smart in their school uniform. It helps them to feel a part of our school community and emphasises that we are part of a whole team. It is also practical enough for everyday wear.

- A blue sweatshirt or cardigan (available with the logo but not essential)
- A gold polo shirt
- Grey skirt, pinafore dress / trousers or shorts
- A blue checked dress in the summer
- Practical black flat shoes or trainers.

(Sling back, mules, heeled shoes are not safe for the children in school.)

PE Kit

- Gold T-shirt
- Blue shorts
- Plimsolls

All clothing needs to be <u>clearly marked</u> with your child's name. We find that the iron-on labels tend to come off quite easily, so if possible please use a marker pen and write directly on the size label or use sew on labels instead. Children will still occasionally come home with other children's sweatshirts or no sweatshirt at all, but we can track down missing clothes more easily when they are named.

Wellington Boots

We go outside every day and in all kinds of weather, so please make sure in addition to a suitable coat your child has named wellies which can remain in school.



CLASS VISIT

Reception Class Visit Tuesday 5 July 2016 9:15am – 12:00pm

The first visit is a chance for the children to see their new classroom, meet their new teachers and any new classmates who will be joining us in September.

With the support of parents and carers we hope to settle all the children quickly and we know the September staggered start will help their confidence.

In September the children are grouped during the first six days. This allows us to get to know the children well and complete their baseline assessments.
