<u>English</u> <u>Class novel: '</u>The 39-Storey Treehouse' by Andy Griffiths

Key texts:

This half term we will be concentrating on the book 'Rapunzel' by Bethan Woollvin

Key Skills

- Practising and refreshing our skills in reading comprehension, spelling, handwriting and writing composition
- Explore different types of sentences and use a variety of sentences within our writing including in an instructional piece of writing.
- Write narratives from different viewpoints and with alternative endings.

Science

<u>Plants</u>

In this unit children have the opportunity to closely study plants and trees in the natural environment, taking measurements and making observational drawings. Children plant a seed and a bulb and will compare them as they grow.

<u>Key Skills</u>

Working scientifically

- To perform simple tests in the context of investigating each of the five senses.
- To gather and record data to help in answering questions in the context of collecting information to solve a puzzle.

Key objectives

- Observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants
- Find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy

<u>Maths</u> Fractions/Height and Length/Position and Direction

We will continue to look at fractions and use our prior knowledge of timetables to help us find equivalent fractions. We will move on to length and height and learn how to measure objects accurately while also using the four operations to solve length and height problems. After that, we will look at position and direction, which links with the coding we have been doing in computing. We will describe movement using the correct mathematical language.

Key Skills

- Compare and order length and height
- Use a ruler accurately
- Decide the correct measurement unit you should chose for the length/height of the object
- Use mathematical vocabulary to describe position direction movement

<u>RE</u>

Who is a Muslim and what do they believe?

We will be introducing the idea that Muslims believe in Allah as the one true God. We will be finding out about the Shahadah, and how this is the most important belief for Muslims. We will be exploring who Muhammad is and how Muslims believe he is God's messenger.

Key Skills

- Give examples of how stories about the Prophet show what Muslims believe about Muhammad.²
- Recognise the words of the Shahadah and that it is very important for Muslims
- Think, talk about and ask questions about Muslim beliefs and ways of living

<u>History</u>

All Hail the Queen Victoria and Elizabeth 1&11

In this unit the children will learn about key events in history beyond living memory while also looking at Queen Elizabeth 11 reign as is closely links with the upcoming coronation of King Charles 3rd. We will explore the key queens of England, comparing their achievements during their reign while also discussing the impact their reigns have on present day UK.

Key Skills

- Comparing and contrasting past and presentday monarchs
- Discus how historical resources provide information about past rulers
- Reason out what would make a good ruler in the past compared to present day

Art and Design

Key artist: William Morris Genre: Tie dyeing and block printing

This topic we will be exploring the work of William Morris, looking at different tie dyeing and block printing techniques using foam, we will then plan and create our t-shirt and finally evaluate our work.

<u>Key Skills:</u>

- Developing ideas based on simple drawings which have been discussed and evaluated.
- Dyeing fabrics
- Design and make a print block from craft foam and card.

Computing

Making Music

This half term the children will be using Purple Mash to create music digitally, they will explore editing and amending compositions, using different sounds and functions, such as tempo.

Purple Mash and School360 continues to be used in school. Please ask Miss Latimer if you need a refresher of your child's log in details, however they should currently be stuck in the front of your reading record.

<u>P.E.</u>

Athletics and Cricket

Our PE session will be delivered by Mr Thompson and a cricket coach. It will mainly take place outdoors. Please ensure your child's PE kit is appropriate for this.

<u>Key Skills</u>

- Use running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination
- Develop flexibility, strength , technique, control and balance
- Take part in outdoor and adventurous activity challenges both individually and within a team

The children's PE kit MUST be in school for the whole half term and be **suitable for outdoor sessions**. No jewellery must be worn on PE days,

<u>Music</u>

This half term the children in Year 2 will have a music specialist coming into school to teach them how to play the ukulele.

In addition, we will learn new songs with an emphasis on good diction and word play. We will be looking at music sung in French and learning some simple French songs.

Key Skills

- Recognise the structure of verse and chorus as well as experimenting with a range of tuned and un-tuned instruments.
- Learn to maintain a body percussion pattern accurately.

<u>PSHE</u>

What helps us grow and stay healthy?

This term's unit explores choices that children can make about looking after their bodies. The lessons look at key areas where children can make safer choices: their body, sleep and exercise, diet, cleanliness and substances. Children will learn facts about each of these areas and learn strategies to manage them.
