Mathematic Development: Proposed learning opportunities:

- Add two single digits together by counting on, and along a number line.
- Lots of activities to support number bonds to 10.
- Subtract 2 single digit numbers using objects.
- Recognise 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p coins and count out different amounts of money.
- Count in 2s, 5s and 10s.
