#### Tuesday Phonics Activity



Musical letters is such a fantastic game. It provides exercise, dance, music, fun and learning all in one!

It is basically musical islands or musical bumps, only with letters.

- First you need to write out some letters on pieces of paper or card (we have taught the following letters so far: m, a, s, d, t, i, n, p, g, o, c, k, u, b, f, e, l, h, sh, r, j, v, y, w, th, z, ch, q, x, ng, nk).
- Place the letters around the floor for the children to dance around.
- The music plays. When the music stops, shout out a letter and the children have to find and sit on that letter. What better way could there be to learn letters?

Challenge- instead of letters use words containing our taught sounds (you could use the CVC words I sent out last Friday)

 You could also use this game for numbers instead of letters, or to learn our tricky words.

# Wednesday Phonics Activity-I SPY

Place on the floor a selection of objects you have in the house (peg, cup, hat, pan, mat, jam, pen, jug etc). Check that your child knows the names of all the objects. Using a favourite toy say the toy says "I spy with my little eye a c-u-p. Ask your child to find the object, hold it up, fred talk the individual phonemes "c-u-p" then blend them together "cup". This game is great for encouaging children to listen carefuly and blend the right word. Repeat with other objects.



#### Thursday Phonics Activity-Treasure hunt

This is a brilliant game to encourage your child to listen carefully to the initial sounds in words.

Provide your child with a basket. Choose from the following taught sounds and ask your child to find objects around the house beginning with these sounds.

E.g. Can you find me something beginning with "s"?

m, a, s, d, t, i, n, p, g, o, c, k, u, b, f, e, l, h, sh, r, j, v, y, w, th, z, ch, q, x, ng, nk



# Friday Phonics Activity-What's the word Mr Wolf?

## Miss Jewitt and Mrs Paterson are modelling this game in todays video

The grown up is Mr or Mrs Wolf and you must stand some distance from your child. Your child calls out "What's the word Mr Wolf?". Mr Wolf then shows the child a picture card (you can use the CVC pictures I have provided or your own pictures at home). Your child then sounds out that word taking one step with each sound. They stop and repeat the game with another word until they reach you.

This game is fantastic for encouraging your child to use their phonic knowledge to distinguish the number of sounds in a word and not just the number of letters.
