- Investigate conditions in a local microhabitat.


Key objectives

<u>Maths</u>

Addition and Subtraction/Shape

We will be adding and subtracting two digit numbers practically using maths manipulatives. We will then be identifying and describing the properties (including the number of sides, line symmetry, number of edges, vertices and faces) of 2D and 3D shapes.

Key Skills

- Number bonds to 100
- Add and subtract 1 and 10 from any number up to 100
- Add and subtract 2 digit numbers
- Describe 2D and 3D shapes using accurate mathematical vocabulary
- Compare and sort common 2-D and 3-D shapes and everyday objects.
- Know the multiples of 2, 5, 10 and 3 timestables

RE

Why does Christmas matter to Christians?

During our RE the we will be developing our understanding of the nativity story. We will be explore the roles of each person within the story and discuss the meaning of gifts and what the story teaches us of what a gift could be. We will describe what King of the Jew means and how Jesus is represented as this through art and hymns.

Key Skills

- Identify the core concepts and beliefs studied and give a simple description of what they mean
- Give a good reason for the views they have and the connections they make

Geography

Mapping out the Weather

We will be comparing different types of maps and start creating our own maps focusing on our local area. We will also be using atlases to find countries in the world and then places in the UK. We will then explore the weather; describing different types of weather including extreme weather conditions. We will compare the weather above and below the equator.

Key Skills

- Identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles
- Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans studied at this key stage

What is Bullying?

We will explore how our actions and words affect others, discuss when it is appropriate to touch others and learn how to ask for and give permission regarding physical touch. We will describe what bullying is and learn how to report bullying or other hurtful behaviour.

Art and Design

Key artist: Monet

The focus this half term is collage. We will be learning about the artist Monet with a focus on his abstract landscapes. We will then use different types of weather as our inspiration to create our own impressionist style collage

Key Skills

- Develop individual collage skills layering, twisting etc.
- Use a range of stimulus for collage work more abstract work – artist link.
- Collages based on simple drawings using different types of paper
- Use natural and found materials to create collages
- Group colours together to create tones and shades

Computing

Coding

This half term the children will be learning about 'Coding', they will start by looking at existing code, 'reading' it and making predictions about what they think will happen when the code is run. They will have time to investigate code, looking at how different parts work. Once children understand how the code works, they will be encouraged to modify it and re-run the program to view the impact of their changes.

Our PE session will be delivered by Mr Thompson and will mainly take place outdoors. Please ensure your child's PE kit is appropriate for this. <u>Key Skills</u>

- Recognise how they work best with their partner.
- Use different rules and tactics for invasion games.
- Understand and develop tactics for attacking and defending.

<u>Music</u>

This half term the children in Year 2 will have a music specialist coming into school to teach them how to play the ukulele.

In addition, we will learn new songs with an emphasis on good diction and word play. We are looking at music with 'Friendship' as the overall theme.

Key Skills

- Recognise the structure of verse and chorus as well as experimenting with a range of tuned and un-tuned instruments.
- Learn to maintain a body percussion pattern accurately.
