Create a tally chart, pictogram and bar graph from the results.</p>	<p>Will it Float?</p> <p>If we were to travel to another country by boat, what would be the best material to make the boat from?</p> <p>Investigate which materials are waterproof and can float.</p> <p>Remember to make predictions before you start your investigation and have a conclusion at the end of your investigation!</p>
