
School Meals – Refunds where account in credit for 2015-16. School meal registers will be balanced on Tuesday 19 July. Where a child has a credit on their account, the amount will be refunded to the parent/carers. If your child's account is in credit they will have a small brown envelope home with them on Tuesday containing the amount to be credited.

Medication - All medication (including inhalers/epi-pens) should be collected from the class teacher by 3.00pm on Tuesday 19 July. Any medicines not collected will be disposed of. Medication can then be returned to school at the start of the autumn term when a new updated 'administering medicine' form should be completed.
