<u>Maths</u> Place Value to 100/Addition and Subtraction

We will continue to use White Rose Maths to support our maths teaching in year 1. This half term will see a mix between place value to 100 including reading and writing umbers as words. We will revisit the strategies previously taught for addition and subtraction and continue to recall our number bonds to 20 facts.

Our homework will shift to a focus on shape, space and measure. This will be a mixture of paper based activities to return to school each Monday and practical activities such as cooking or measuring.

We will continue to count in 2s, 5s, 10s daily as we prepare the children for work on 'times tables' as they move to year 2.

<u>Science</u>

Experiments and Working Scientifically

We will be consolidating the learning from all of the subjects so far through a series of simple investigations and experiments. We begin with a simple investigation linked to our very first topic 'animals including humans.' I wonder what information they can remember?

<u>RE</u>

Who am I? Where do I belong?

In this unit, children will combine teachings from a range of key religions. They will discuss the different groups they belong to and how they know this. They will talk about why belonging is important. They will find out about some symbols of belonging used in Christianity, Judaism and Islam. Exploring welcome ceremonies in different religions will deepen the children's understanding of the symbols that represent belonging to these faiths. Reading the story of The Lost Sheep they will discuss the idea that everyone is valuable. They will explore how people show love for each other and compare the promises made during wedding ceremonies across the religions studied. They will conclude their learning by finding out how different community and faith groups come together to support each other at different times of need.

Geography

Seaside Locations

In this unit the children will learn about the 4 countries that make up the United Kingdom including their capital cities. The children will identify features of different seaside locations around the United Kingdom paying close attention to Whitley Bay and Tynemouth. Children will explore the features of the seaside locations including physical and human features using first-hand observation and experience to enhance their awareness along with essential map skills and fieldwork.

Key Skills

- Knowledge: Key features of seaside locations
- Concepts: Location and place, cause and effect
- Skills: Using an atlas, reading maps and photographs

<u>PSHE</u>

Who helps us stay safe?

We will be thinking about who can help us in a range of situations including at school, home and in the wider community. We will be looking at how to seek help for ourselves and others including how to seek help in an emergency.

We will be revisiting the NSPCC Pants rule where we will think about how to keep our bodies safe.

Once again, this learning will form part of our health and relationships education in school. If you have any questions about this please come and speak to me.

<u>Art and Design</u> Key artist: Andy Goldsworthy (3d Art)

We will explore the world of sculptures and discover the work of Andy Goldsworthy. The children will use papier mache to create a class sculpture that represents our time together over the last 2 years. We will develop our evaluating and art appreciation skills by reflecting on the work we produce.

<u>Key Skills</u>

- Develop an understanding of 2D and 3D in relation to artwork
- Look at sculpture by known artists as a basis of own work
- Look at sculptures and try to recreate them

<u>P.E.</u>

The children will now have 2 PE lessons each week. PE kit MUST be in school for the whole half term and be **suitable for outdoor sessions**. No jewellery must be worn on PE days which are Tuesday and Friday.

Tuesday's session will be delivered by Mr Thompson and will mainly take place outdoors. Please ensure your child's PE kit is appropriate for this. Our focus will be striking and fielding. We will master basic skills such as throwing and catching and we'll begin to apply these in a range of activities. We will participate in team games, developing simple tactics for attacking and defending.

Friday's session will continue to be Cricket! The children have loved these sessions and have developed their batting skills over the previous half term.

Computing

Computing will be taught by Mrs Somerville each Thursday afternoon. This half term the children will be creating their own digital story book, they will explore adding animation, sound, voice recordings and backgrounds through Purple Mash.

The children will also have access to the iPads within the classroom. They will be used to support learning across a range of subjects.

School360 continues to be used in school. Please ask Miss Baxter if you need a refresher of your child's log in details.

<u>Music</u>

We continue to use the charanga scheme in class where we will be following the unit 'Round and Round' We will look at pulse and rhythm and pitch in different styles of music. We'll be returning to the glockenspiels to learn to play a simple tune building on this each week.

We will continue to critique the song of the week talking about what we like and dislike, showing respect when other people have a different opinion. We will continue to identify the different parts of compositions using specific vocabulary such as instrumental solo, verse and chorus.
