2. A bike race is 950 m long.

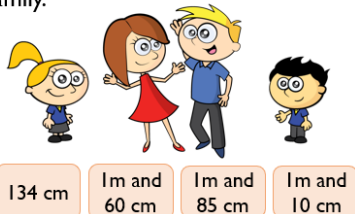
Teddy cycles 243 m and stops for a break.
